We do so by addressing the developmental needs of immigrant and minority girls and their families living at or below the federal poverty level in Montgomery County, Maryland. Our integrated 4th through 12th grade after- and out-of-school Girls Program supports the growth of our young women by helping them understand their potential and life choices, learn creative strategies to become leaders, and break their family's cycle of poverty using education as a vehicle. We further extend the impact for CB girls by wrapping their own efforts with mentoring, college and career planning and programs to provide resources and support for their families.
